

New Proposed Regulation

FSU-5.001 University Admissions.

The admission of students to Florida State University is governed by this regulation.

(1) In the admission of students, the University takes into consideration each applicant's academic ability and other factors such as creativity, talent, and character. The University's admissions process must also comply with Section 1001.7415, Florida Statutes.

(2) Undergraduate Admissions. All undergraduate applicants, including First-Time-in-College (FTIC) applicants, transfer applicants, readmission applicants, transient applicants, and non-degree seeking applicants, must meet the general admission requirements as set forth in the University General Admission Policy and posted in the University's General Bulletin and Admissions website, as well as those requirements for the relevant academic unit and all applicable Florida Board of Governors regulations pertaining to their admission. Exceptions to these requirements may be permitted on an individual basis where allowed by federal and state law, Florida Board of Governors regulations and governing University regulations and policies.

(3) Graduate and Post-Baccalaureate Admissions. All graduate applicants must meet the general graduate admission and graduate readmission requirements as set forth in the University General Admissions Policy and posted in the University's General Bulletin and Admissions website, as well as those requirements for the relevant academic unit and the Graduate School and all applicable Florida Board of Governors regulations pertaining to their admission. College and program admission requirements are implemented by the University through the appropriate graduate admissions committees or the academic dean's office and University minimum requirements for admission are posted in the General Bulletin. Exceptions to these requirements may be permitted on an individual basis where allowed by federal and state law, Florida Board of Governors regulations and governing University regulations and policies.

(4) International Students Admissions. Applicants are considered international if they are not U.S. citizens, dual citizens, or Permanent Residents. Within enrollment, space, and fiscal limitations, eligible international students may be accepted for admission to the University consistent with state and federal law, this University admission regulation, the University General Admissions Policy, and the requirements set forth in Florida Board of Governors Regulation 6.009 or as otherwise required by regulation or law. The requirement for English proficiency is established in the University General Admissions Policy.

(5) Mandatory Disclosure of Misconduct. The University requires disclosure of criminal conduct, pending criminal charges, and educational misconduct on the application to

determine whether the admission of the applicant is in the best interest of the University. The University reviews all applications and may refuse to admit an applicant due to misconduct, including but not limited to situations when such actions have been found to disrupt or interfere with the orderly conduct, process, functions, or programs of any prior institution attended.

- (a) Applicants who fail to disclose criminal misconduct, pending criminal charges, or any educational misconduct, or who fail to give complete and accurate responses and/or documents, are in violation of this disclosure requirement and may be subject to appropriate action by the University, including denial of admission or readmission, revocation of admission, disciplinary action, and/or invalidation of credits or degrees earned.
- (b) Applicants are required to promptly notify the University should any information subject to this regulation that was previously provided on the application change prior to enrollment in the University. This includes the obligation to furnish information concerning events that must be disclosed as part of this disclosure requirement which occur prior to enrollment in the University. Failure to provide such information may subject the applicant to revocation of admission, disciplinary action, and/or invalidation of credits or degrees earned.

(6) Admission of students to Florida State University is within the jurisdiction of the University President as specifically delegated by the University Board of Trustees, and shall be in accordance with the University's mission and goals, subject to the standards adopted by federal and state law and Florida Board of Governors regulations.
